



MANNY MEDRANO JOINS KTLA NEWS

Los Angeles, September 27, 2007 –

KTLA has announced that commencing October 8th, Manny Medrano joins the Emmy award winning KTLA News Department. He spent the last three years as a correspondent for ABC Network News in Washington D.C., covering the U.S. Supreme Court and providing legal analysis for all ABC News broadcasts. As a member of the Supreme Court press corps, Mr. Medrano covered important national news stories, including the addition of two new justices to the high court, as well as landmark decisions involving abortion, affirmative action, the death penalty and other controversial issues.

Prior to ABC, Mr. Medrano was a general assignment reporter with KNBC. His assignments included legal analysis and commentary for the station's coverage of O.J. Simpson, the Menendez Brothers, Reginald Denny and Rodney King, among others. His comprehensive coverage of the O.J. Simpson case earned him an Emmy Award and Golden Mike Award.

"Manny Medrano is an exciting addition to KTLA's news coverage and analysis of the events that affect Los Angeles," said Vice President/General Manager Vinnie Malcolm.

News Director Rich Goldner states, "Manny brings immensely valuable experience and insight, not just on the legal side but all stories. His local and national experience complements our reporting perfectly."

Before joining KNBC, Mr. Medrano was a trial lawyer in private practice in Los Angeles. He also served as an Assistant U.S. Attorney for the Los Angeles U.S. Attorney's Office, where he never lost a jury trial. He successfully prosecuted the 1985 kidnapping and murder case of DEA agent Enrique Camarena, and earned a prestigious Department of Justice prosecutorial award for his service. He is a graduate of Harvard College and Harvard Law School. Fluent in Spanish, he was named to Hispanic Business Magazine's "100 Influentials List 2005". He is actively involved in numerous charitable organizations, and has served as an adjunct professor at four southern California law schools.

Last month, KTLA was awarded an Emmy for the *Prime News* at 10PM and 2007 has been a banner year for other Emmys and awards for its news coverage of the Southland.

2007 marks the 60th Anniversary for the station, which has been celebrated with the station receiving a Star on Hollywood Boulevard as well as the recently concluded exhibit at the Paley Center for Media.
